

How to engage with States Members

The States of Alderney has ten elected members with responsibilities allocated as set out in the States Member responsibilities document.

Members of the public can engage with States Members and access States information in a variety of ways.

Activity	Action in place or required
Personal contact and 1:1s	Members of the public are welcome to meet with individual members on a 1:1 basis to discuss issues within the published areas of responsibility.
People's Meeting	<p>The monthly People's Meeting allows engagement on two levels:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Formal discussion on items due to be debated at the next States meeting. This takes place one week before the States meeting and items to be discussed are published in the Billet D'Etat. ii. A wider ranging discussion on issues of importance to the public. From July 2014, this is on a trial basis where written questions are invited in advance for a detailed response in Part 2 of the People's Meeting. The deadline is noon the Friday before the People's Meeting on the following Wednesday. <p>Written responses to the questions are published on the website as soon as possible after the meeting.</p>
Minutes from meetings	Draft minutes from Committee meetings are published on the website as soon as possible after the meeting.
Hansard	The monthly States debate is recorded in States Hansard which is available on the website as well as in hard copy from the President's Office.
Press releases	Press releases are produced after committees and other significant events.
Website	States information is published on the website. Development of the site is under review.
Library and notice boards	States information is also placed in the library and on notice boards outside the Town Church and the Court Office.
